RELATIVE TO REAFFIRMING THE **GUAM** LEGISLATURE'S CALL FOR A MORATORIUM ON DEEP-SEA MINING IN PROTECTION OF THE LEGAL, ECONOMIC. SOCIAL, CULTURAL, ENVIRONMENTAL RIGHTS OF THE PEOPLE OF GUAM, AND OBJECTING TO THE PROPOSAL AND REQUEST FOR INFORMATION (RFI) BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR'S BUREAU OF **OCEAN ENERGY** MANAGEMENT (BOEM) "COMMERCIAL **FOR LEASING** OUTER CONTINENTAL SHELF MINERALS OFFSHORE THE COMMONWEALTH OF THE NORTHERN MARIANA **ISLANDS**"

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I

2 MINA'TRENTAI OCHO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- 3 WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guahan (the Guam Legislature) on December 6,
- 4 2021, (in its 36th term) unanimously passed Resolution No. 210-36(COR) which called

- on the United States to support and implement a moratorium on deep seabed mining in
- 2 the U.S. Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) to safeguard cultural resources, protect ocean
- 3 ecosystems from environmental harm and exploitive industry interests, and to ensure
- 4 the health of Guam's people; and
- 5 WHEREAS, on November 12, 2025, the United States Department of Interior's
- 6 Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) issued a Request for Information (RFI)
- 7 as Docket No. BOEM-2025-0351 for the "Commercial Leasing for Outer Continental
- 8 Shelf Minerals Offshore the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI)";
- 9 and
- WHEREAS, the BOEM RFI originally set the comment deadline for December
- 11 12, 2025, and following a joint letter from Governor David M. Apatang of the
- 12 Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and Governor Lourdes A. Leon
- Guerrero of Guam to BOEM's Acting Director Mr. Matthew Giacona requesting a 120-
- 14 day extension of the public comment period on Docket No. BOEM-2025-0351, on
- 15 December 12, 2025, BOEM granted a 30 day comment period extension until January
- 16 12, 2026; and
- WHEREAS, the Guam Legislature finds BOEM's 60 day comment period
- insufficient for full and meaningful consideration and input from the people of Guam
- who together with the people of the CNMI will unjustly bear all environmental, cultural,
- and social adverse effects of the proposed deep-sea mining; and
- WHEREAS, the BOEM RFI seeks interest in the commercial leasing of
- approximately 35,483,044 acres along the length of the Mariana Islands chain for
- 23 offshore deep-sea mining operations; and
- WHEREAS, Guam is approximately 128 nautical miles from the proposed
- 25 mining area and is the southernmost island of the Mariana Islands chain which consists
- of Guam, Saipan, Rota, Tinian, Farallon de Medinilla, Anatahan, Sariguan, Guguan,
- 27 Alamagan, Pagan, Agrihan, Asuncion, and Maug; and

WHEREAS, deep-sea mining operations pose environmental and ecological risk of irreversible harm to unique deep-sea ecosystems and large-scale biodiversity loss even beyond the footprint of the mining in an area of exceptional biodiversity and ecological sensitivity, potentially impairs the carbon sequestration process reducing the ocean's ability to store carbon, and exacerbates climate vulnerability where stressors already heighten ecological and atmospheric instability; and WHEREAS, the Guam Legislature recognizes the social, cultural, and economic impacts of deep-sea mining will disproportionately harm the indigenous Chamorro community of Guam, whose livelihoods, cultural identities, food systems, and spiritual traditions are inseparable from the surrounding ocean, including loss of fisheries, damage to sacred seamounts used in traditional navigation, and loss of culturally significant ocean spaces; and WHEREAS, the BOEM RFI is blatantly and unjustly void of benefit-sharing, consent, or compensation mechanisms to offset the harms of environmental, cultural, and food-security losses to the people of Guam; and BOEM's proposal for deep-sea mining near Guam without consent strips the Government of Guam and the people of Guam of any control of decision-making, enforcement authority, stop-work authority, or remediation requirements for damages; WHEREAS, legal defects in BOEM's RFI under international and domestic law include violations of Self-Determination and Permanent Sovereignty Over Natural Resources; Failure to Obtain Free, Prior, and Informed Consent (FPIC); Duties to Protect and Preserve the Marine Environment; the U.S. Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act (OCSLA); and the U.S. Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA); and WHEREAS, the BOEM RFI is legally flawed, scientifically unsound, and gravely disrespectful to the Indigenous peoples of the Marianas. Deep-sea mining in the U.S.-asserted EEZ adjacent to the CNMI and Guam would impose irreversible ecological harm and undermine Indigenous rights and cultural integrity, while

- 1 conferring no economic benefits to local populations. For these reasons, BOEM must
- 2 suspend this RFI and commit to a precautionary approach until the rights, interests,
- 3 and knowledge of the indigenous peoples—and the ecological integrity of the
- 4 Marianas—can be fully safeguarded; now, therefore be it
- 5 RESOLVED, that *I Liheslaturan Guahan* (the Guam Legislature) does hereby
- 6 renew and reaffirm its call for a moratorium on deep-sea mining in protection of the
- 7 legal, economic, social, cultural, and environmental rights of the people of Guam, and
- 8 does object to the proposal and Request For Interest (RFI) by the United States
- 9 Department of Interior's Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) for
- 10 "Commercial Leasing For Outer Continental Shelf Minerals Offshore the
- 11 Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands"; and be it further
- 12 **RESOLVED,** given the overwhelming scientific uncertainty and legal
- deficiencies impacting the people of Guam, and the disproportionate impacts on the
- indigenous community of Guam, *I Liheslaturan Guahan* (the Guam Legislature) hereby
- calls on the United States Congress, the Department of Interior and the Bureau of Ocean
- 16 Management to adopt a precautionary moratorium on deep-sea mining activities in the
- 17 EEZ in question; to immediately suspend RFI Docket No. BOEM-2025-0351; to
- 18 conduct a full environmental and cultural impact assessment incorporating traditional
- 19 knowledge, meaningful indigenous consultative and consent measures consistent with
- 20 FPIC, evaluation of alternatives to deep-sea mining, including no action, and legal and
- 21 economic frameworks ensuring equitable treatment of the CNMI and Guam; and be it
- 22 further
- 23 **RESOLVED,** that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules
- 24 certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of
- 25 the same be thereafter transmitted to President of the United States Honorable Donald
- 26 J. Trump, Vice President and Senate President Honorable James David Vance, United
- 27 States Senate Pro Tempore Honorable Senator Chuck Grassley, Honorable Speaker
